NEW REQUIREMENT

<u>Update Requirement</u>

Chief of Course (CC), Race Administrator (RA) and Timing and Calculations (TC) in addition to USSA Alpine Officials who are certified as a Jury Adviser, Referee or Technical Delegate are required to attend an update/clinic at least every two years to maintain certification. Our current roster lists the last year we have a record of a clinic/update. Members who took a clinic last fall are listed as "09". If you did not attend a clinic last fall you need to attend one this fall to remain current. In 2010 Chief of Race (CR) will be required to have an update also.

Chief of Course. (CC)

A **NEW CLINIC** & test that will cover Chief of Course requirements. Must be a CR or RF-1 and have proven skiing ability.

RMSRO Advancement Procedure

In order to advance in level you are responsible for supplying the RMSRO Board with two completed Recommendation forms. In the spring (May) the Board meets to advance all members who have fulfilled the requirements for advancement, i.e.: turned in work cards indicating the correct number of days worked and have two recommendations. RMSRO recommended advancements are sent to USSA in early June. For those who sent your activity cards after the end of May. We update the data base and award any advancement in the early winter after the fall clinics have been completed and send a second list of upgrades to USSA. RMSRO does not automatically advance anyone.

Activity Record (Work Cards)

If you wish credit and want to advance, we need a record of what races you have worked. To do this you need to send in your work card. If you don't have one, please send a list of what race days you worked, the name of the race, number of days, and your position. USSA keeps track of days worked on USSA Scored events and some non-scored events. You can print it out at USSA.ORG. I you miss one year, you can still send in your work history for credit.

And last but not least there are

New Homologation Rules: "By the 2010-2011 season, all USSA alpine races, all events, for all age classes, scored and not-scored, must be conducted on trails which have been homologated by FIS or USSA or approved by USSA following inspection and favorable report." Make sure your area is ready to conform.
