Bob Dart, A World Champ

Bob Dart has been selected as one of the Technical Delegates for the World Alpine Ski Championships in Borneo, Italy. Bob whose involvement with ski race officiating dates back

to 1977. In 1981 Dart became involved with RMD ACC In 1983 he was elected to the RMD Board of Directors and has served as president since 1990. In 1988 Dart became a FIS Alpine TD and now is on the Alpine Committee for the FIS along with being on the Nor Am Committee.

Certification Level Correction

We now have a form to assist you in correcting your level number (1,2,3,4) in any of the given officiating categories in the alpine officials classifications (CR,CC,RF,RA,CO,DM). As example, if you are listed as a level one referee and you feel that you should be rated as a level 2 referee, then this is the form that you need to fill out and send in. Remember that to move up we must have 2 recommendations from higher-level officials. To become a level 3 TD or T & C you must pass a level 3 exam. There is a recommendation form available on the web site along with the correction form

Timing Equipment

Timing equipment including, start gates and finish cells will require homologation beginning in the 03-04 season. This applies to all FIS events.

Equipment Regulations

USSA will be imposing length restrictions for USSA racers beginning with the 04-05 season. It is recommended that skis, boots and standheight be controlled at all Nor Am and National Championship events. A control procedure of equipment at FIS, Jr. Olympic and USSA level events is under review. USSA TD's are working with staff to encourage athlete compliance with standheight and bootsole thickness rules.
